### 4.3 Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Notes to physician : To the Doctor: This product contains mineral oil. Accidental injection with this oil-

based product, even in small quantities, can cause intense swelling which may, for example, result in ischaemic necrosis and the loss of a digit. Expert PROMPT, surgical attention is required and may necessitate early incision and irrigation of the

injected area, especially where there is involvement of finger pulp or tendon.

**Specific treatments**: In case of accidental self-injection of oil emulsion vaccines, get medical attention

immediately.

SEEK IMMEDIATE MEDICAL TREATMENT at nearest Hospital Emergency Room even if only a very small amount is injected, as failure to treat may result in the mineral oil adjuvant causing sterile abscess and/or loss of affected finger or thumb. ### 8.2 Exposure controls

Appropriate engineering controls

Good general ventilation should be sufficient to control worker exposure to airborne contaminants.

#### Individual protection measures
